However, we must again report to our homeowners and tenants that there are simply too many instances of doors, sliding doors, garage doors, and gates being left open (35 premises in the month of March). As a result, alarms are unnecessarily triggered, leading to unnecessary trips being made. All this time could have been utilized more effectively for crime prevention efforts.

We also urge homeowners and tenants (witnesses) to exercise patience when involved in a positive crime case (e.g., theft, housebreaking, where a suspect has been arrested). Patience is crucial when summoned to court and while attending court proceedings. We implore you to persevere and collaborate with all stakeholders to ensure that these "shoppers" are dealt with appropriately and kept off the streets.

It is also very important for our homeowners and tenants to communicate with their garden service, pool service providers, window cleaners, or any other services regarding the collection of keys to gain access to your premises. Currently, too many alarms are being triggered by these services, leading to unnecessary trips to reset alarms (valuable time that could be allocated to crime prevention). These services should retrieve keys and inform our control room of their entry into your premises using the following contact numbers.
